LINCSearch Bookmarklet Helps You Borrow Instead of Buy

Shopping for a book online? You may decide to borrow the book from your library instead. You can now quickly check Lincoln Trail Libraries System's shared online catalog (LINC) to see if the book is available at your local library or from one of the 95 LINC libraries in East Central Illinois.

Lincoln Trail Libraries System (LTLS) has provided a customized LINCSearch Bookmarklet that searches the LINC catalog for any item located on several Internet book sites such as Amazon, Barnes & Noble, and others. One click takes you from any item display page on Amazon or Barnes & Noble and performs a search for that item in the LINC Online Catalog.

How does it work? Items in Amazon or Barnes & Noble use a standard number to describe each item, and libraries use the same number. So, as long as you are viewing an Amazon or Barnes & Noble page that contains the ISBN (International Standard Book Number), you can use the LINC Bookmarklet to find the item in the LINC Catalog.

LINCSearch Bookmarklet works only from your browser's tool bar. It is easily installed by dragging a link to the toolbar. Instructions for adding this to your browser toolbar and for using Bookmarklet are located at <http://www.lincolntrail.info/lincbookmarklet.html>.
